GIFT....Growing In Faith Together...at Advent David and Goliath is a story from the Bible, one that many of you may have learned growing up. Goliath is a nine foot tall giant who holds the entire Israelite army in fear and no one dares to go and fight him. It takes an unlikely figure, a shepherd boy named David, with an unwavering faith in God who slays Goliath.

Many of us face similar situations today. It may not be a literal giant holding us captive. Our giant may be fear. addiction, anger, rejection or even comfort that has control of us. These giants paralyze us, causing us to not live in the fullness and freedom of life that God has intended for us.

"Goliath *MUST* Fall" is the DVD study **GIFT** will be using this year. Led by Pastor Louie Giglio he examines the story of David and Goliath to reveal how we must slay our giants. The key to living free from our giants is not better slingshot accuracy, but keeping our eyes on Jesus, the one and only giant slayer. Put your hope in Jesus and watch Goliath fall.
