# **GIFT...G**ROWING IN FAITH TOGETHER... At Advent

"Comfort *Must* Fall" is the topic for our March 17 GIFT session in the "Goliath Must Fall" series. Right now I am imagining that there may be some of us saying to themselves, or maybe out loud: "You're kidding? Comfort must fall? I'm kind of partial to a roof over my head, food to eat and not being on anyone's dislike list." If we think about it though, David stepped out of his comfort zone, relying on his faith in God, to confront the giant Goliath that all the soldiers were afraid of. Think of times in history when people have stepped out of their comfort zone and fought the oppression of slavery. Or the persecuted Christians in foreign lands who, even today, worship God in secret locations to avoid being arrested (or worse) by their governments. What about the Apostles who left their lives behind to take up and follow Jesus. Sometimes, at our workplaces, out in a restaurant, at school, in a store, your neighborhood, or any number of places you may be confronted by an uncomfortable situation or asked to defend or explain your Christian beliefs.

With Pastor Louie Giglio's guidance we will explore in this session how a sneaky, yet prevalent, giant called Comfort can keep us from stepping out in faith in the ways God is calling us to. We will see how that giant has been defeated in our lives. Our job isn't mustering up our courage to step out, it's remembering some key facts: "Life is short. God is big."

#### Good-bye Alleluia!

The solemn Season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, March 6, marking the departure of the word "Alleluia" in worship. "Alleluia" will return on Easter morning, April 21, as we celebrate the glorious Resurrection of our Lord!

### LENT

Lent is the 6-week/40 day (excluding Sundays) period leading up to Easter, the most important festival in the Christian calendar. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Easter, with the last week of Lent being called Holy Week. Lent is a time of sacrifice and remembrance as we remember when Jesus went into the desert to fast and pray before beginning his work for God. During this time Jesus was tempted several times by Satan, but was able to resist. On Ash Wednesday, we attend a service during which we are marked on the forehead with a cross of ashes as a symbol of our recognition and admission of sin and our mortality.

Lent is a time of discipline, sacrifice and preparation. In lieu of giving up a favorite food, you may wish to consider a more meaningful discipline, such as adding a time of daily worship or devotion to your schedule. Reading your Bible or a devotional book each day, or special Lenten services, are appropriate Lenten disciplines.
