Vision of Advent

Advent seeks to be a biblically-faithful, dynamically growing, spiritually healthy and exciting church, reaching out to the community with the love of Jesus Christ in the power of the Holy Spirit.

The West Shore Healing Room

The West Shore Healing Room will open on Tuesday, August 13 at Advent. Led by Bill Benedict, The West Shore Healing Room, which is certified by the International Association of Healing Rooms in Spokane, Wash., will have a team to offer personal prayer for physical and emotional healing.

The room will be open on the second Tuesday of each month from 7:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. No appointment is necessary and there is no charge. The International Association of Healing Rooms coordinates 2,946 healing rooms in 68 countries.

Baptism, Confirmation, Reaffirmation of Baptismal Vows, and Reception into the Episcopal Church: As we understand it in the Episcopal Church, "Holy Baptism is the sacrament by which God adopts us as his children and makes us members of Christ's Body, the Church, and inheritors of the Kingdom of God. (Book of Common Prayer, BCP, p. 858)." "Holy Baptism is full initiation by water and the Holy Spirit into Christ's Body the Church. The bond which God establishes in Baptism is indissoluble. (BCP p. 298)." "Infants are baptized so that they can share citizenship in The Baptismal Covenant, membership in Christ, and redemption by God (BCP p. 858)."

What is "Confirmation" in the Episcopal Church? Confirmation is a sacramental rite in which candidates "express a mature commitment to Christ, and receive strength from the Holy Spirit through prayer and the laying on of hands by a bishop" (BCP, p. 860). "In the course of their Christian development, those baptized at an early age are expected, when they are ready and have been duly prepared, to make a mature public affirmation of their faith and commitment to the responsibilities of their Baptism and to receive the laying on of hands by a bishop (BCP p. 412)."

What is "Reaffirmation of Baptismal Vows"? Baptized persons who have returned from a time of religious inactivity to an active practice of faith may publicly reaffirm their baptismal vows. Others who have experienced a renewal of faith or desire to renew their Christian commitment may also reaffirm their baptismal vows. Reaffirmation may be repeated. What is "Reception" into the Episcopal Church? Those who have already made a mature Christian commitment in another denomination are recognized as members of the one holy catholic and apostolic church, and received into the fellowship of the Episcopal Church and the Anglican Communion.

"Confirmation, Reception and Reaffirmation are rooted in The Baptismal Covenant. Preparation for Confirmation/ Reception/Reaffirmation should help the candidates discover the meaning of Christian commitment in their lives, and explore ways that their Christian commitment can be lived." Baptism, Confirmation, Reception, and Reaffirmation may be combined in one service with a bishop present.

Heads-Up: Baptism, Confirmation, Reception, Reaffirmation: In August 2016 Bishop William Love, Bishop of Albany of the Episcopal Church, visited Advent and celebrated at a healing service. We are keen to have him return, he is asking to return, and we'd like his visitation to embrace baptism, confirmation, reception, and reaffirmation of baptismal vows. Therefore, we are asking all in our Advent family to consider whether family members or friends are interested in being baptized as youth or adults, whether there are baptized persons desiring confirmation, whether there are folks who want to reaffirm their baptismal vow, and whether there are people who wish to be received into the Episcopal Church. Formal preparation is required of candidates for confirmation. Parents, godparents, and sponsors of those being baptized and others reaffirming and being received may also choose to participate in such preparation. Therefore, over the next 3 weeks, please pray about possible candidates and inform JoAnn in the church office of their names. Preparation sessions will include The Baptismal Covenant, Holy Eucharist, The Lord's Prayer, The Ten Commandments, The Apostles' Creed, The Nicene Creed, forms of prayer, and discipleship.
