At Advent

Worship is scheduled for Sundays at 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. We will be celebrating the Holy Eucharist with a special service.

This Sunday

This Sunday we will be celebrating the Sacrament of Baptism. In my article this week I want to speak about this important and early part of our spiritual journey.

Transformation, becoming different, is a way of life for us...we don't want to be who we are and we will try all sorts of things to change. Crash diets, plastic surgery, new hairdos, new clothes. In truth we really want to just change the outside covering.

A man was selling an old warehouse; the building had been empty for months and needed repairs. Gangs had damaged the doors, smashed the windows, & thrown trash everywhere. As he showed a prospective buyer the property, the man said that he would replace the broken windows, bring in a crew to correct any structural damage, & clean out the garbage.

"Forget about the repairs," the buyer said. "When I buy this place, I'm going to build something completely different. I don't want the building; I want the site. Compared with the renovation God has in mind, our efforts to improve our own lives are as trivial as sweeping a warehouse slated for the wrecking ball.

When we become God's, the old life is over, He makes all things new. All he wants is the site and the permission to build.

Water baptism represents the burial of the sinful life and the resurrection of the new life. The escape from Egypt for the Israelites represents an escape from the bondage of sin. Moses presented salvation to them. He came to free them from their past. (Exodus 14:19-28)

The walking through the waters at the Red Sea represents what happens after salvation. After salvation we must walk the process of being delivered from our past life. The Israelites left Egypt in one day, but it took 40 years to get Egypt out of the Israelites.

Not only did the walking thru the water represent the process after salvation, but the sign that the Egyptians all died in the water represents how our old life will chase us, but we must take the step of letting the past die in the water.

The act of water baptism is a response of obedience by the believer. Infant baptism is a decision by the parents to bring their child under the covenantal covering of their faith. The parents pray that their child will in years to come, make the same decision that they have made for themselves. The core necessity for heaven is the seal of the Holy Spirit & that's given when you confess with your mouth & believe in your heart that Jesus is Lord.

The New Testament Revelation: Jesus' last recorded words on earth were. "He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved." Mark 16:16. Jesus' very call to believe on Him includes a call to be baptized.

Water baptism is a powerful reminder of God's grace. The person we were before is dead forever, and we are raised with Jesus as a totally new creation: We are saved from the punishment of sin. We are being saved from the power of sin. We will be saved from the presence of sin.

The promise is that if you do allow God into every area of your life, He will radically change it and work it for your good. Truly "old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new." Has this proved true in your life?
