Living Beyond the Limits

Our Gospel message this week from John 17:11-19, is Jesus' prayer for His disciples and therefore also for us. He is preparing to return to the glory and perfection of heaven and is asking Father God that by sending forth Holy Spirit, that His people would be protected even though the world is not always a safe place.

How appropriate that is for us today. As we peruse the news (that's almost poetic), we grasp that all is not well, both in our community as well as across the nation.

Jesus asks, "They do not belong to this world any more than I do. Make them holy by your truth, teach them your word, which is truth."

There had been relative security for the disciples when Jesus was with them, now He was preparing them for a time when they would be without Him, not at all the future they had envisioned. What would be their unwanted reality now? They didn't yet grasp the coming of Holy Spirit upon them.

The promise was that the disciples would not be alone at all. Jesus would be with them in an even greater dimension because He was going home to Father God. That is also a strong reminder and encouragement for us. It doesn't matter what is in front of us, what we are dealing with, our Lord is intimately involved and available to us.

In the presence of Holy Spirit (I am practicing using the personal form of the third person of the Trinity, Holy Spirit. We speak of Jesus personally, and Father God in the first person as well, why not Holy Spirit? More on this concept later) we can break through barriers we would not even approach on our own.

One of those barriers, I believe, is fear. The Lord at times calls us to walk in faith to places that are beyond our normal limits. Fear can actually be a boundary that wants to keep us from reaching a desired goal. Our fears may be based on things that are unknown or on possible outcomes of circumstances that we imagine.

The threshold of obedience is often marked by the boundary of fear. Fear places an imposing limit on our lives. We listen to its voice and respond instinctively by fright or flight rather than the voice of Jesus who said in the Gospel: "*Keep them safe from the evil one.*" Fear is not from our Lord, so it's a tactic of the evil one. Fear whispers: "what if", "how can I?", "what if I fail?" "What if my child won't speak to me if I draw this hard line on their moral behavior?"

These phrases cause us to panic. They tend to bring us to a halt. They shut us down. They stop us at the boundary of obedience.

Jeremiah 32 reminds us that God WILL inspire fear in us. We risk much more by being fearful of men than of God. Fear is a boundary that can be crossed! God inspires us to cross that threshold, to move beyond our normal limits, to take on more than we often believe we are able to accomplish. We bridge our fear by the presence of heaven in our hearts and mind.

There can be much to rationally fear in the world, yet the Word says I have not given you a spirit of fear! Blessings on your week as you seek to walk in the peace of the Lord.
