Pentecost Sunday 2021

John 7:37-39^a (NASB) Now on the last day, the great day of the feast, Jesus stood and cried out, saying, If anyone is thirsty, let him come to Me and drink. ³⁸ "He who believes in Me, as the Scripture said, 'From his innermost being will flow rivers of living water.'" ³⁹ But this He spoke of the Spirit, whom those who believed in Him were to receive.

The Gospel for this Pentecost Sunday comes from the last day of The Feast of Tabernacles at which Jesus promised what we now know to be Pentecost, the birthday of the church. Tabernacles was the most popular festival of the three annual celebrations in Jerusalem. A requirement for Tabernacles was that every Jewish male must go to Jerusalem; of course his family would participate was well. This gathering was to be a reminder of God's provision during the forty years of wandering in the wilderness after escaping from Egypt through the Red Sea.

In that wilderness God was present in the tabernacle that Moses had erected, following an exact heavenly blueprint. At the Feast each family built a small booth or tent and lived in it during the seven day celebration. In John 1 we read that the word became flesh and tabernacled among us. As God was in the wilderness tabernacle, Jesus now was in the flesh in Jerusalem.

A daily highlight of each of the seven days was the ceremonial drawing of water. At daybreak priests went from the Temple to the pool of Siloam and filled a golden pitcher and brought it back to the Temple. As they approached the south side of the Temple, trumpets sounded three times. As the pitcher came to the altar, the Temple choir sang the Hallel, which was Psalms 113-118.

When the choir began the first verse of Ps. 118, all the males shouted with them three times: "Give thanks to the Lord." One priest came to the altar and poured out wine and water into the two silver bowls. Now the choir same Ps. 118:22, "The stone rejected by the builders has become the corner stone."

On the 7th day, the priest circled the altar seven times. This is where John 7:37-39 fits in. Now we connect it to the following: Acts 2:14-18 (NASB) But Peter, taking his stand with the eleven, raised his voice and declared to them: "Men of Judea and all you who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you and give heed to my words. ¹⁵ "For these men are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only the third hour of the day; ¹⁶ but this is what was spoken of through the prophet Joel: ¹⁷ 'AND IT SHALL BE IN THE LAST DAYS,' God says, 'THAT I WILL POUR FORTH OF MY SPÎRIT ON ALL MANKIND; AND YOUR SONS AND YOUR DAUGHTERS SHALL PROPHESY, AND YOUR YOUNG MEN SHALL SEE VISIONS, AND YOUR OLD MEN SHALL DREAM DREAMS; 18 EVEN ON MY BONDSLAVES, BOTH MEN AND WOMEN, I WILL IN THOSE DAYS POUR FORTH OF MY SPIRIT AND THEY SHALL PROPHESY.

Jesus Himself was the fulfillment of this Feast!

What an incredible moment that was for God's people, and they simply didn't grasp the impact of what was happening in front of them. As we celebrate Pentecost today, the outpouring of Holy Spirit on His Church, are you walking in the fullness of all that Jesus promised?

Pentecost

On the Day of Pentecost, the climax of the 50 days of the Easter Season, we celebrate the fact that our Lord sent the Holy Spirit, the comforter and strengthener, to reinforce the faith of the Apostles. Upon receiving this gift, the Apostles went out into the world to preach, teach and bap-



tize in Christ's name. Thus at Pentecost, we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and the anniversary of the Church's birth. The color for this day is red, symbolizing the tongues of fire that appeared to hover over the disciples on that first Pentecost.

Bishop Rescinds and Relaxes Certain COVID Guidelines

Effective this Sunday, Pentecost on May 23 Bishop Hollingsworth has issued new guidelines that replace all previous protocols and guidelines. Here's what applies to Advent:

- Out of respect for those who feel at risk, we'll continue to wear masks indoors. Masks are not needed when we're outdoors.
- By now, people have chosen to "social distance" themselves according to their personnel risk assessment and comfort level. We will continue to respect people's individual decisions.
- We will not replace the yellow ropes marking off every other pew.
- Communion will continue to be wafers only, with distribution in front of the altar single-file as we've been doing.
- Singing is allowed, while wearing masks.
- Choir activities can commence based on how and when Dar and her team choose to move forward.
- We'll "pass the peace" in ways each person feels comfortable fist-bumping, hand-shaking, waving, etc. while respecting and taking a cue from the other person's behavior.
- In-person meetings, Bible studies, birthday/anniversary celebrations, celebration of graduation, fellowship activities, baptisms, etc. can resume consistent with the above.
- Outside groups like CODA can resume using Advent facilities.
- We'll continue with one Assistant at each service, who fulfills the acolyte, lector, and prayers of the people functions.
- We'll continue to Zoom the 10:00 service, funerals, baptisms, etc.

Jason will continue with the cleaning and sanitizing on a weekly basis.

Thanks for the prayers as we "almost resume normal" church activities. Hope to see more and more return to in-person gatherings!
