Welcome to Advent Episcopal Church and may God bless your worship today!

The Gospel reading for this week is John 3:16. Along with Psalm 23, these are two of the most famous verses in the Bible. Several life-changing truths are seen in John 3:16.

The first truth: God's love, is foundational to everything that follows. But can anything more be said about the love of God that Christians don't already know? Let me give it a brief shot. God's love is not uniform or monolithic. What I mean is that God loves different people and different things differently. His love is multifaceted.

The Bible talks of God's love for his Son, and of the Son's love for the Father. John 3:35: "The Father loves the Son and has given all things into his hand." In John 14:31, Jesus says, "I do as the Father has commanded me, so that the world may know that I love the Father."

This is a dimension of divine love that is almost beyond comprehension. God loves us in spite of our sin, but there is no sin in the Godhead that might impede or limit the love that the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit have for each other. There is no obstacle that might diminish the love that the persons of the Godhead have for each other. Their mutual love is perfect. No shadows, no history to be forgiven.

The second truth: God's love for his creation. Psalm 145:9 declares "the Lord is good to all, and his mercy is over all that he has made". Jesus, in Matt. 5:44-45, commands us to love our enemies and pray for those who persecute us so that we may be seen to be sons of our Father who is in heaven, "for he makes his sun to rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and the unjust." God's love leads him to make provision even for those he created who hate him.

The third truth: God's love for the sinful fallen world. That is what we find here in John 3:16. In spite of how we sometimes react and respond to the darkness that is in the world, Father God loves the sinful fallen world.

The fourth truth: God's love for Israel. Deuteronomy 7:6-8 "The Lord your God has chosen you to be a people for his treasured possession, out of all the peoples who are on the face of the earth. It was not because you were more in number than any other people that the Lord set his love on you and chose you, for you were the fewest of all peoples, but it is because the Lord loves you".

This doesn't mean that everyone who was an Israelite was saved. We know that many within the nation were rebellious and turned to idolatry. But God loved the nation as his covenant people and blessed them. This doesn't mean there is no sense in which God loved other nations. But he didn't love them in the same way that he chose to love

The fifth truth: God's love for his elect, redeemed people. This is a love that goes beyond merely providing physical blessings. This is the love that actually brings us into a saving relationship with him. God goes beyond merely offering them eternal life. He actually works in their hearts to overcome rebellion and unbelief and leads them to faith in

Ephesians 2:4-5 "God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved us, even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ." This love conquers and overcomes spiritual death and gives new and eternal life.

This is just a brief excursion into the depths of John 3:16, that sign you regularly see at football games...but it is much more than a sign, it is a declaration of the richness of God's love.



Trinity Sunday

Trinity Sunday is the first Sunday after Pentecost in the liturgical calendar, and is the day on which the Doctrine of the Trinity has been celebrated since the late middle ages. With Trinity Sunday, we see the culmination of our Lord's teachings as set forth in the creed. Now it is us up to us to grow and

mature, as seems to sum up best the purpose of the six months long season of Pentecost. We must grow and develop in the love of God the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit

The color for Trinity Sunday is White.

Bishop Rescinds and Relaxes Certain COVID Guidelines

Effective this Sunday, Pentecost on May 23 Bishop Hollingsworth has issued new guidelines that replace all previous protocols and guidelines. Here's what applies to Advent:

- Out of respect for those who feel at risk, we'll continue to wear masks indoors. Masks are not needed when we're outdoors.
- By now, people have chosen to "social distance" themselves according to their personnel risk assessment and comfort level. We will continue to respect people's individual decisions.
- We will not replace the yellow ropes marking off every other pew.
- Communion will continue to be wafers only, with distribution in front of the altar single-file as we've been doing.
- Singing is allowed, while wearing masks.
- Choir activities can commence based on how and when Dar and her team choose to move forward.
- We'll "pass the peace" in ways each person feels comfortable fist-bumping, hand-shaking, waving, etc. while respecting and taking a cue from the other person's behavior.
- In-person meetings, Bible studies, birthday/anniversary celebrations, celebration of graduation, fellowship activities, baptisms, etc. can resume consistent with the above.
- Outside groups like CODA can resume using Advent facilities.
- We'll continue with one Assistant at each service, who fulfills the acolyte, lector, and prayers of the people functions.
- We'll continue to Zoom the 10:00 service, funerals, baptisms, etc.

Jason will continue with the cleaning and sanitizing on a weekly basis.

Thanks for the prayers as we "almost resume normal" church activities. Hope to see more and more return to in-person gatherings!
