This week's Gospel: Mark 3:20-35

The reading for this week is about an encounter with the Jewish leaders. In the confrontation, Jesus is accused of accomplishing powerful works by the ruler of demons, the devil himself. Jesus states blaspheming the Holy Spirit is the unforgivable sin. What strikes me is the magnitude of respect which Jesus holds for the Holy Spirit. So in this week's article I want to address the role and importance of the third person of the Trinity.

In last week's Gospel:

John 3:5-7 (NLT2) ⁵ Jesus replied, "I assure you, no one can enter the Kingdom of God without being born of water and the Spirit. 6 Humans can reproduce only human life, but the Holy Spirit gives birth to spiritual life. 7 So don't be surprised when I say, 'You must be born again.'

After Pentecost, the Holy Spirit comes upon and into the lives of believers in a unique and permanent way. In Matthew 10 Jesus speaks of a time when a Christian might be brought before a governing official because of their faith. He declares that the Spirit of God will empower us in that exact moment. The Holy Spirit will come upon believers in an extraordinary way for special tasks. This means that we should indeed ask the Holy Spirit's help as we face our daily problems as well as life's major challenges.

Matthew 10:19-20 (NCV) ¹⁹ When you are arrested, don't worry about what to say or how to say it. At that time you will be given the things to say. ²⁰ It will not really be you speaking but the Spirit of your Father speaking through

Likewise in dealing with personal issues The Holy Spirit, now identified as the Comforter is available to us as well. Imagine the over three billion believers worldwide, but yet, when you or I have a need, the Spirit of God is instantly available to us.

John 14:15-20 (NCV) If you love me, you will obey my commands. ¹⁶ I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper to be with you forever— ¹⁷ the Spirit of truth. The world cannot accept him, because it does not see him or know him. But you know him, because he lives with you and he will be in you. ¹⁸ "I will not leave you all alone like orphans; I will come back to you. ¹⁹ In a little while the world will not see me anymore, but you will see me. Because I live, you will live, too. ²⁰ On that day you will know that I am in my Father, and that you are in me and I am in you.

The Holy Spirit is the promised presence of God within each believer because of the miraculous outpouring of Pentecost that was the result of Jesus death on the cross and His resurrection and finally His ascension into heaven. Jesus even stated to the disciples that it was for them and for us that He go because of what would occur on Pentecost.

We are living post-Pentecost, so all of His promises made on earth are immediately available to us in every moment and situation of our lives. It's a stupendous promise, but one that gives moment by moment peace, for he will never leave us as orphans, but He will come to us.

Relaxation of COVID Restrictions

Effective June 2, in accordance with Governor DeWine guidance, we will no longer recommend wearing masks nor maintaining social distancing during our worship services and other meetings. It is an individual's decision whether to continue such protocols or whether to dispense with them. No judgment one way or the other. Singing can happen "maskless". We will resume receiving communion wafers from the altar rail however the consecrated wine will be consumed only by Paul. We'll "pass the peace" in ways each person feels comfortable – fist-bumping, handshaking, waving, etc. – while respecting and taking a cue from the other person's behavior. In-person meetings, Bible studies, birthday/anniversary celebrations, celebration of graduation, fellowship activities, baptisms, etc. resume consistent with the above. Ushers can hand out bulletins at the doors into the sanctuary. The hearing assist aids are available from the ushers. Zoom access will continue to be offered for the 10:00 a.m. service via PC, tablet, and smartphone. Welcome back!
