November is Adoption Awareness Month

November is dedicated to raising awareness about the importance of adoption and the needs of orphans waiting for forever families. Many at Advent have been touched by <u>earthly</u> adoption – family and friends have opened their hearts and homes by adopting orphans, have served as foster parents, and have financially supported others in this expensive process. But it's also important to remember that each of us has been spiritually adopted: Ephesians 1:5 says "God decided in advance to adopt us into his own family by bringing us to himself through Jesus Christ. This is what he wanted to do, and it gave him great pleasure"; James 1:27 says "The worship that God wants is this: caring for orphans or widows who need help."; and Deuteronomy 10:18 instructs "He does what is right and fair for the child without parents". Let's give thanks that God has adopted us into His spiritual family and let's give thanks that others have adopted orphans into their earthly families.
