The American Revolution: Was it an Act of Biblical Rebellion?

As we celebrate Independence Day this weekend, I offer some varying points of view on this title. No right or wrong answers or conclusions, just points to ponder – some from today and some from the American Revolutionary era.

Was the American Revolution an act of rebellion against God and the Bible, especially "Submission to Governing Authorities" in Romans 13? Today, John McArthur (Pastor of Grace Community Church and host of the national radio program "Grace to You") asserts: "People have mistakenly linked democracy and political freedom to Christianity. That's why many contemporary evangelicals believe the American Revolution was completely justified, both politically and scripturally. They follow the arguments of the Declaration of Independence, which declares that life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness are Divinely endowed rights. . . . But such a position is contrary to the clear teachings and commands of Romans 13:1-7."

Such a view today does not reflect the extended theological debates that occurred during the times of the Revolution. Then, some but not all Christian and political leaders turned to the Bible and found much guidance on the subject of civil disobedience and resistance to tyrannical civil authority. Famous heroes of the Bible including many in the Hebrews 11 "Faith Hall of Fame" were accorded their special position of honor because they committed civil disobedience (e.g., Daniel, Rahab, Moses, and the Apostles in Acts 4-5) against tyrannical commands of civil and religious rulers. The Founders believed that they were not in rebellion against God's ordained institution of civil government; they were only resisting tyranny and not the institution itself. The second Scriptural viewpoint overwhelmingly embraced by most Americans during the Revolutionary Era was that God would not honor an offensive war, but that He did permit civil self -defense (e.g., Nehemiah 4:13-14 & 20-21, Zechariah 9:8, 2 Samuel 10:12, etc.).

Perhaps today's critics disagree with the theological positions held by the Founding Fathers, theologians, and ministers of that era, but it does not mean that there was no Biblical basis for the American Revolution. What do you think?
